What is Research.gov?

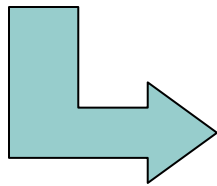
Research.gov...

- Is a new initiative led by NSF that provides a menu of high priority services for multiple federal agencies in one location
- Is a modernization of FastLane and based on established policies and business processes that NSF employees, applicants, and awardees are familiar with.
- Is taking a phased approach to offer services that align with the needs of the research community and federal partner agencies.
- Aims to ease the grants administrative burden, one of the greatest challenges faced by the research community.
- Is a research-oriented solution for delivering Grants Management Line of Business (GMLOB) Consortium services.

Why Research.gov?

- In 2004, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) launched the Grants Management Line of Business (GMLoB) Initiative to streamline grants management activities across agencies
- In 2005, OMB selected NSF to lead a Grants Management Consortium focusing service delivery on the research mission
- The selection was based on NSF's:
 - Focus on the research community
 - Twelve years of success with FastLane capabilities
 - Reputation for high standards in the research community
 - Leadership position in the grants community
 - Experience with government-wide initiatives

Research.gov Partnerships

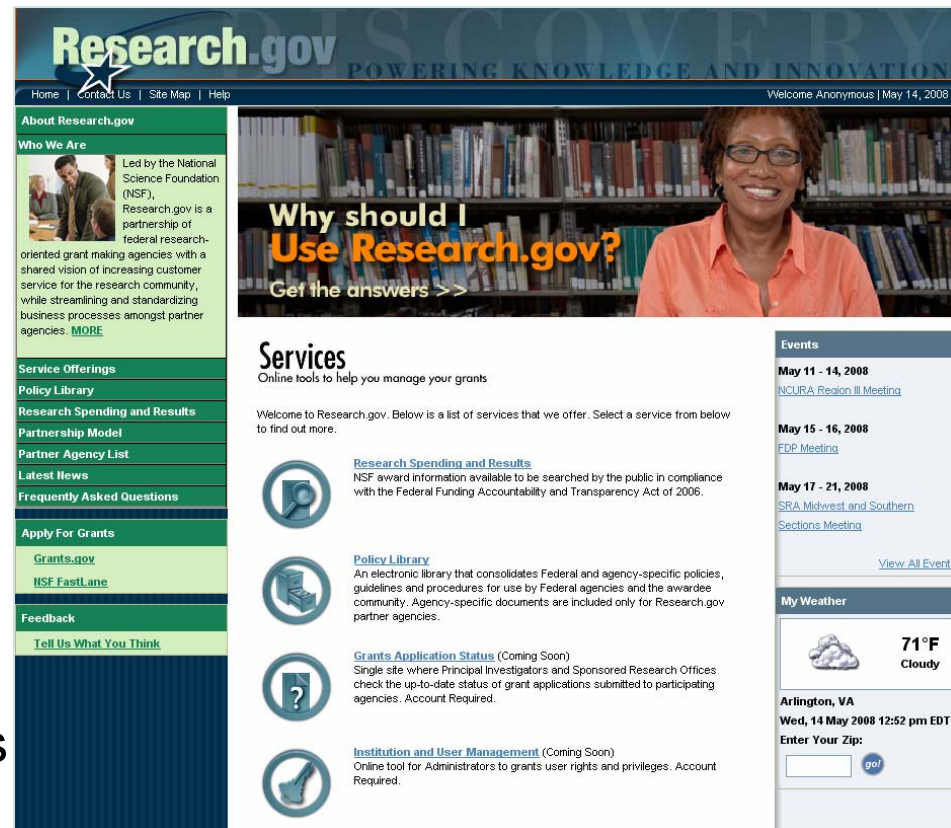
- **Research.gov** simplifies the research community's access to information and grant services for **multiple federal agencies**
 - National Science Foundation (Consortium Lead)
 - National Aeronautics and Space Administration (Partner)
 - Department of Defense Research (Partner)
 - USDA's Cooperative State Research, Education, and Extension Service (Partner)



Research.gov Released!

- In December 2007, NSF released initial public-facing service offerings, including:
 - Research Spending and Results
 - Policy Library
 - Research Headlines

- In February 2008, NSF released initial business services for registered grantees in Beta mode:
 - Grants Application Status
 - Institution and User Management





This is Just the Beginning...

- Research.gov will deliver services based on the priorities of the research community. Candidate upcoming service offerings include:
 - **InCommon Pilot** – Tool to allow grantees to login to Research.gov using credentials issued by their research institution.
 - **Principal Investigator/Reviewer Profile Update** - Integrated online tools to allow Principal Investigators and Reviewers to update their profile in one easy place.
 - **Federal Financial Report** - Online tool to complete and submit grant financial reports using the new government-wide standard form.
 - **Research Performance Progress Reports** - Online tool to complete and submit research performance progress reports using the new government-wide research and related dataset.
 - **Research Spending and Results Sub-award Search** - Sub-award information from NSF and partner agencies available to be searched by the public
 - **Payments and Cash Requests** - Online tools to request electronic funds disbursement and payment.
 - **Program Officer Service** - Tools for program officers to find information and manage their grant portfolios.
