FY 2010 Budget Request

- ➢ FY 2010 Budget: \$7.045 Billion (+\$555 million)
- NSF is part of President's Plan for Science and Innovation: double federal investment in basic research over 10-years: \$11B by 2016
- Launches Presidential initiative to triple number of new graduate research fellowships by 2013
- Major themes include:
 - New Faculty and Young Investigators
 - Workforce Development
 - Climate Change
 - Clean Energy



Potentially Transformative Research – all research directorates provide funding to leverage activities aimed at increasing support for transformative research



American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 - NSF

NSF Programs Receiving Recovery Act Funding

> \$3 billion supplements FY 2009 funding

- \$2 billion for Research and Related Activities for proposals already in house and that will be reviewed and/or awarded prior to September 30, 2009.
- \$ 1 billion to award funds as specified in the Recovery Act

New Proposal and Award Policies and Procedures Guide (PAPPG) issued April 6

New guidance added on complying with the mentoring requirement of the America COMPETES Act

Special Information, Review Record, and Return without Review Sections/Chapters have been updated



BFA Human Capital Plan Updates

- March 12, 2009- draft Keeping our Edge (KOE) BFA Human Capital Strategic Plan was released for BFA review and comment
- April 21, 2009- draft KOE Implementation Outline released for BFA review
 - BFA staff asked to identify three top priorities among the opportunities for implementation
 - Staff comments received May 8 are undergoing review



FY 2009 Financial Statement Audit

- Held Audit Entrance Conference on March 17, 2009
- Areas of emphasis will include:
 - Grant accounting and post award monitoring
 - Contract monitoring
 - Property, equipment and construction in progress amounts
 - Compliance with laws and regulations, including American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) and OMB Circular A-123 "Management's Responsibility for Internal Control"
 - Site visit to Raytheon Polar Services Corp. in Denver (mid-August)
