## What is Research.gov?

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Research.gov...

- Enables institutions and grantees to:
  - access a menu of grants management and information services
  - for multiple federal agencies
  - in one place
  
- Modernizes FastLane by providing services:
  - tailored to meeting the unique needs of the research community
  - aimed at easing the grants administrative burden
  
- Increases transparency and public access to information about federal research spending and outcomes

## Research.gov Partnerships

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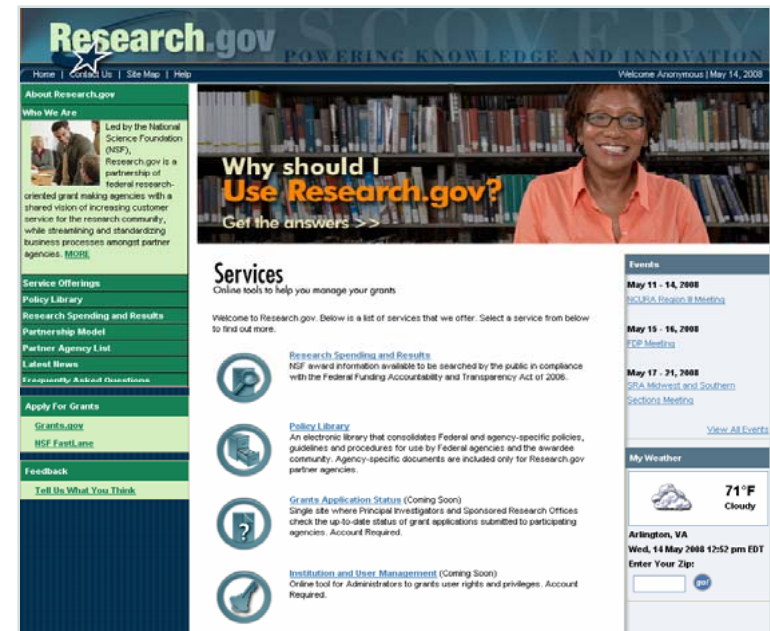
- **Research.gov** simplifies the research community's access to information and grant services for **multiple federal agencies**
  - National Science Foundation (Lead)
  - National Aeronautics and Space Administration (Partner)
  - Department of Defense Research (Partner)
  - USDA's Cooperative State Research, Education, and Extension Service (Partner)



# Current Research.gov Services

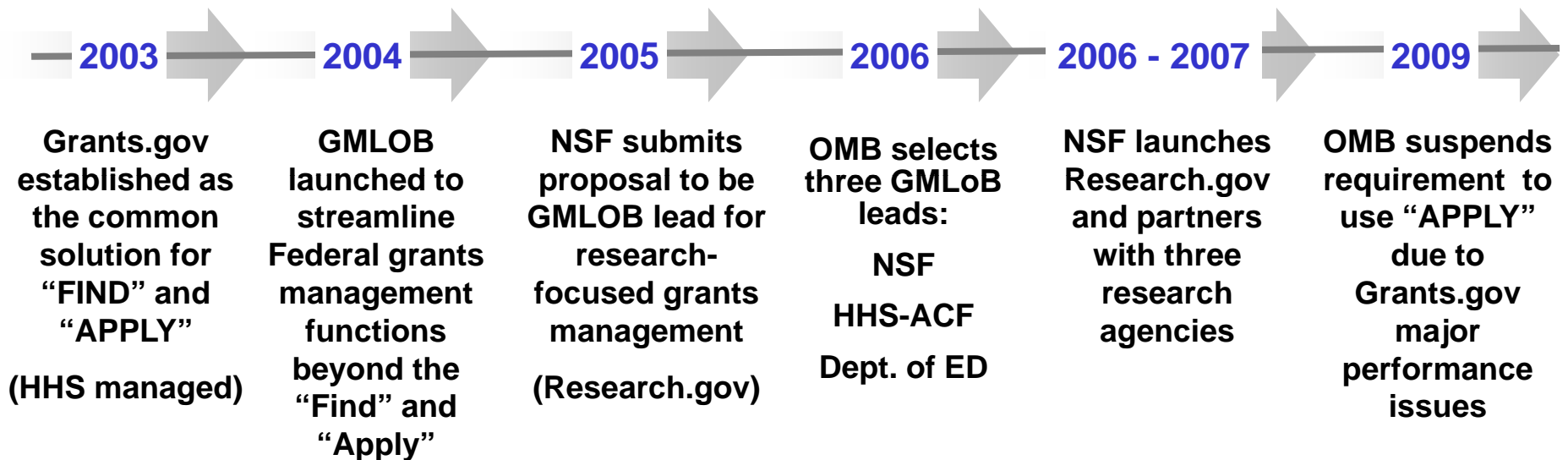
Launched in December 2007, current offerings include:

- Public-facing Services
  - Research Spending & Results
  - Policy Library (Government-wide)
  - Research Headlines
- Grantee Services to:
  - View the status of grant applications
  - Principal Investigators
  - Sponsored Projects Offices
  - Submit Federal Financial Reports
  - Manage institution and user accounts



## Why NSF moved forward with Research.gov

- NSF needed to modernize FastLane and could only do so if selected by OMB to lead a grants management consortium
- Allowed for continued use of FastLane while Research.gov is being built out
- Responded to the research community's demand for FastLane-type services for multiple research agencies





## Update on Grants.gov

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- On March 9, 2009, OMB issued a Memo to agencies requesting they use alternative solutions for “APPLY” to alleviate the serious capacity issues Grants.gov is experiencing. NSF has reported to OMB:
  - We will use our long-established FastLane capabilities for proposal submission
  - In our role as a GMLOB consortium lead, we are exploring the feasibility of Research.gov offering some limited "APPLY" functionality to research agencies.
  
- OMB likely path forward:
  - Fix Grants.gov capacity issues (possibly by the end of the year)
  - Pilot using GSA FedBizOpps solution for “FIND” and “APPLY”



## Opportunity for NSF

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- Agencies were asked by OMB to consider alternatives to Grants.gov's "APPLY."
- NSF completed a high-level assessment and white paper for modernizing FastLane's "Application Preparation and Submission" through Research.gov.
- The assessment was reviewed and endorsed by the NSF Executive IT Resources Board (ITRB) and the supporting Capital Planning and Investment Control Process (CPIC) Working Group.
- We are seeking the Committee's advice and feedback on the plan for move forward.
